

# Using This Planner

BE PREPARED – ALWAYS READ AHEAD!

*Interpretations in this Planner are based on solid astrological theories, but how a day affects your chart and your life can be different than its generic nature suggests. For your most important activities (business start-ups, major purchases, marriage, surgery, etc.), it's always recommended you consult with your astrologer.*

We can't be certain how much of our lives is fated and how much is free will. Let's assume it's a combination and that our choices matter. Astrology helps us make better-informed choices. It offers an educated guess about the future based on similar conditions in the past. There is never an exact repeat of the planetary patterns, and each indication can express in a multitude of ways. Janet's Plan-its presents possibilities. As the planets and signs are mentioned, try using the Keywords on the inside back cover – or the expanded list on [JanetsPlan-its.com](http://JanetsPlan-its.com) – to arrive at your own speculations.

When a day doesn't sound so nice, you aren't doomed to have a bad experience. The message is a warning to watch out for difficult behavior in others and to monitor your own. It's just information to help you on your journey through life. An analogy is driving. You're going to get to your destination sooner or later, one way or another, but the trip is smoother if the traffic lights are green and you'll get there sooner than if the lights are red. When the planets play nicely together, it's like you're encountering green lights; challenging planetary energy is like having to stop at red lights.

Janet's Plan-its list the "generic" nature of astrological occurrences. Some days, the interpretations apply to your life noticeably. Other times, you may see the situations described happening **around** you but not **to** you. How a day affects you personally depends on your exact time and place of birth. An individual astrological chart is more accurate than any astrology calendar can be. Janet's Plan-its is the next best thing. Rather than letting the planets have their way with us, we can put their energies to work, keeping them busy in a manner of our choosing, trying to steer them to our advantage.

- **Adjust for Your Time Zone:** Janet's Plan-its lists times in Eastern (E) and Pacific (P) times. For Central, subtract one hour from Eastern. For Mountain, add one hour to Pacific. Times are adjusted for Daylight Saving Time.

- **Day Ratings:** Each day is rated as to the difficulty or ease that the planets present us. A **1** is most challenging; a **5** is the easiest. The rating number appears to the right of the designation for the day of the week: **SA** = Saturday, **SU** = Sunday, etc.

- **Planning with the Planets:** When scheduling your important activities, look for days rated **4** or **5**, or at least try to avoid days rated **1** or **2**. It's also a good idea to steer clear of days when a planet changes direction (listed in 2007 On a Page). Check the daily messages for days or portions of days that sound good for your plans. Powerful days (marked **P**) are potent but not necessarily easy. Read the weekly Highlights and daily message for clues on how to proceed, or consult your astrologer. (If you don't have an astrologer, you can contact me. I serve clients via phone and email.) You can also check the planets and their connections in the brackets below the weekly Highlights and read their meanings on the Keywords list on the inside back cover. - **Weekly Highlights:** A must read each week! In fact, read ahead to upcoming weeks. If a challenging period is coming up in a few weeks, you may want to handle important matters before then. More information is in the Star Pages at the back of the Planner. For a complete picture of any given day, read earlier than the date to find what's in effect then. (You may need to back up several months or see **As We Begin 2007** at the start of the Star Pages to see what influences all the different planets are offering us.)

- **Details:** Below the weekly Highlights, you'll find a listing of the details of the week's planetary activities. When you see a ★ on a daily line, check the **Star Pages** at the back of the planner for further details.

- **Moon Void of Course:** (see Keywords on the inside back cover) Avoid beginning anything new after the time listed for Moon Void until the next time you see that the Moon enters a sign. It's fine to continue ongoing endeavors or complete projects during a waning moon or a Void of Course Moon. Also, avoid major purchases when the Moon is Void. That's considered a time of "buyer's regret."

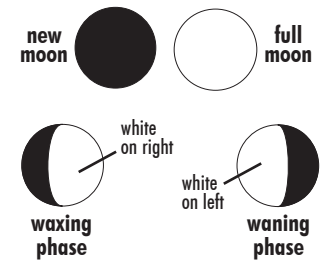
- **Mercury Retrograde:** Try not to begin anything new during this time (days are marked **MR**). If you must take action, be careful with all information exchanges. Allow extra time to arrive for appointments. Read contracts carefully before signing.

- **Venus Retrograde:** Challenges are encountered about relationships or finances and we may have to repeat old lessons or re-do activities (days are marked **VR**).

- **See 2007 On A Page** (following the year's weekly pages) for important information about periods when the planets appear to move backwards, called "Retrograde." There is also a handy list of the year's New and Full Moon dates and the degrees of the zodiac where they occur. Look for degrees close to parts of your birth chart to see which cycles will affect you strongly.

- **Your Birthday Influences:** The conditions present at your birthday impact you from three months before your birthday until nine months afterward, when your next birthday's factors go into effect. Read the Highlights and Star Pages for the week in which your birthday falls and note the factors present at the closest New Moon prior to your birthday. Your year may have elements described in the daily messages for your birthday as well as the day before and after it. A **4** or **5** rating then is a good indication for an upbeat year; a **1** or **2** rating shows your year will have challenges. A **P** promises intensity that could go either way, easy or challenging. See the suggestions above in "Planning with the Planets" about how to handle Powerful days.

## MOON CYCLES



New Moons begin a 29-30 day cycle that takes on the flavor of the factors present at the New Moon. It peaks halfway through the cycle at the Full Moon, which is impacted by conditions present then. Read the Highlights for the weeks of New and Full Moons to optimize their influences. The Moon's sign changes every two or three days, giving a general indication of moods, behavior and circumstances. This Planner tells you the Moon's sign each day and the exact time when it changes.

The Moon's appearance increases from New Moon to Full Moon, then decreases until the next New Moon. Every day, Janet's Plan-its shows you what the Moon looks like in its current phase of the cycle. If you want growth in an activity, begin it during the waxing phase between a New Moon and a Full Moon (see above). Continue ongoing activities any time. It works well to complete projects after a Full Moon and before the next New Moon (waning phase). If there's something you want to decrease, begin it during the waning phase. (Examples: hair shouldn't grow as quickly after a haircut then; tumor surgery is better during the waning phase.)

### 01-07 HIGHLIGHTS

Many a reveler will throw caution to the wind and act out of character at this year's New Year celebrations. We tend toward excesses, especially with the Moon almost full. 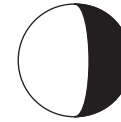

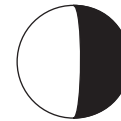

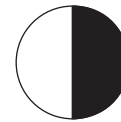

## 15-21 HIGHLIGHTS

The intense energy at the close of last week continues this week, hitting a crescendo Tuesday evening. Check the headlines for important events locally and internationally. When the Sun enters Aquarius Saturday [3:02 am (P); 6:02 am (E)], we'll have three planets in that friendly but quirky sign for the following week. Enjoy it, whether you're socializing or pursuing your own individual interests.
